What is National Tree Day?

National Tree Day is an annual community tree planting event in Australia organised by Planet Ark in partnership with Toyota to encourage a nationwide volunteer nature care initiative. The 2016 National Tree Day will be held on Sunday 31st July, however schools are encouraged to participate on Friday 29th July.

Beyond the teenage years....

National Tree Day has been reconnecting nature and the community for 20 years and has involved 3.8 million people and 22.3 million trees and plants.

Not only does National Tree Day benefit the environment and our local communities, but it also makes you HAPPY! New research undertaken by Planet Ark identified that nature has the ability to influence happiness as it has direct effects on the brain and reduces the body's response to stress.

"Spending time outside and in nature is a free and easy way to increase happiness and wellbeing, and incorporating this into the lives of Australian children now could help address the current path that we are on to creating the unhappy generation."

- Over 120 natural remedies from the rainforest can be used as medicines
- Healthy forests absorb all those nasty greenhouse gases and carbon emissions we create through living our modern day lives

And sadly 80% of the world's forests have already been destroyed.

Fun Fact

The average Australian produces 7.7 tonnes of carbon/year.

To offset this they would need to plant at least 24 eucalyptus trees and nurture them to a circumference of 1m.
